My sister Saamia recently turned 18 in January & goes to SCEI. Here are a few stories of our little Saamia who is the the light of our life!

Saamia, our ray of hope and sunshine. She was born into this world in the winter of 1999 when all of us siblings were too young to realize that she was special. And indeed she was! Special as she always bore a beautiful smile on her face. Special as she always needed our help hence was totally inseparable. And mostly special as she was dearly loved by everyone including her 3 year old sister who unlike most children wasn't at all jealous of why everyone paid more attention to Saamia than her.

Saamia initially could not walk, so her crawling movement restricted mobility and exploration, but little did we know that she was quite sharp in observing others. She watched her older sister climb on a cupboard and access all the toys, so she cleverly copied the movement – unfortunately it led to a fall and she was rushed to the hospital. That wasn't the only time we were struck with the horror of losing her. When she was only 6 months old, the doctors diagnosed her with water in her lungs and she was hospitalized for quite some time. Injections punctured her all over, from her skull to her tiny little feet. She bravely endured it all, while we only prayed and wept.

Saamia's beautiful smile always brings blessings to our occasions. We always encourage her participation in any event large or small: from birthday parties to small family gatherings or dinners. She is always the first one to get ready and the most excited! We embrace her as the beautiful person she is.

She has a heart of gold and is extremely sensitive as well. She always knows when one of us is upset and she will come wipe away tears tears and literally take all the worries away. She always appreciates surroundings, and can make my day simply by saying "AHAAA" or "Wow" if she sees me wearing a beautiful outfit. Her favorite hobby is arranging things and my oh my, what an immaculate organizer is she! From setting the dinner table to finishing every last bit on her plate, she possesses manners that every parent would want to inculcate in their own little ones.

She is our biggest blessing from Allah- extremely obedient and organized, and greeting everyone with a handshake or a hug and loves to share food and toys.

Launch of Pakistan's first Down syndrome Clinic at AKUH

KDSP teamed up with The Aga Khan University Hospital (AKUH) for a revolutionary 'one stop health solution' to facilitate parents bringing their child with Down syndrome, to see different specialists at AKUH, in one clinic. Up until now, parents would struggle to find the appropriately trained specialists to treat separate health challenges faced by their children with Down syndrome.

A team of internationally trained and experienced child specialists practicing at the AKUH, led by Dr. Salman Kirmani and Dr. Babar Hasan, joined forces with the world renowned Down syndrome expert, Dr. Brain G. Skotko, as well as the founder of KSDP, Mr. Ali Allawala, and staff, to share best clinical practices for Down syndrome management at a session held in the AKU auditorium, on 9th April 2017. This session was attended by medical professionals and students, parents & families of people with Down syndrome as well as supporters of the cause.

Speaking about the launch, Dr. Salman commented,



"The new Down syndrome Clinic at the AKUH became possible because of conversations with KDSP. We have been informally working with KDSP for 3 years, and now spreading the word so the medical community is aware and can guide these individuals to the Down syndrome clinics where all their healthcare needs can be met."

While speaking live from Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston, on this occasion of the first Down syndrome Clinic launch in Pakistan, Dr. Brian Skotko said,

"According to a research study by the American School of Medical Genetics about self-perceptions from people with Down syndrome, about 99% expressed being happy with their lives", and even though it is challenge and adjustment for families, "99% of the parents, and 97% of the siblings, love their child/sibling with Down syndrome."


Morning Shows
