The book aims to present an optimistic view about Down syndrome to new mothers of children with Down syndrome and to mothers expecting a baby with Down syndrome. The CEO at KDSP, Ali Allawala, and Tania Naima Khan were invited to the Lahore Literary Festival, held on March 24, 2018, to speak about the upcoming South Asian version of Hope and to highlight its significance in changing perceptions about Down syndrome amongst the people of Pakistan and those of other South Asian countries.



RESEARCH PRESENTATION AT THE ANNUAL COMBINED SECTIONS MEETING (CSM) BY THE AMERICAN PHYSICAL THERAPY ASSOCIATION (APTA)

The Physical Therapy Department at KDSP has made us all proud by conducting the first research of its kind on "The Effect of Early Intervention Physical Therapy using the Parent Empowerment Program for Pakistani children with Down Syndrome." The research was accepted for a poster presentation at the annual Combined Sections Meeting (CSM) by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) held on February 23, 2018 at New Orleans. The research poster also won the Global Health SIG award for Social Responsibility.
