

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What is Down Syndrome?

About 1 out of every 700 babies born in the world has Down syndrome. Down syndrome is a genetic condition caused by a full or partial, extra copy of chromosome 21. This additional genetic material alters the course of physical and intellectual development of an individual. A few common physical traits of Down syndrome are low muscle tone, small stature, an upward slant to the eyes, and a single deep crease across the center of the palm.

However, each person with Down syndrome is a unique individual and may possess these characteristics to different degrees, or not at all. Down syndrome can be found in people of all ages, races, religions and economic backgrounds.

The Karachi Down Syndrome Program (KDSP) is a non-profit organization formed in March 2014 by a group of concerned parents and passionate individuals who realized the need for a platform to advocate the value, acceptance and inclusion of people with Down syndrome living in Karachi and to provide them with an opportunity to lead self-sufficient and fulfilling lives.



CEO's Note



As we reached a milestone of having over 1500 individuals with Down syndrome and their families registered as part of our Family Network we expanded to a new facility, a second KASHTI - KDSP Learning Center (KLC).



KDSP's Family Network has drastically grown over the last year and especially during the peak COVID times, due to which we required more space for our network as tough times brought every one of us together. As we reached a milestone of having over 1500 individuals with Down syndrome and their families registered as part of our Family Network we expanded to a new facility, a second KASHTI - KDSP Learning Center (KLC). It is heartwarming to witness the trust families place in KDSP to help improve the lives of their loved ones with Down syndrome. This trust serves as one of the driving forces for us to enhance our capacity and quality of services. At KLC we facilitate two essential services - Education and Skills Development.

Due to our growing Family Network we wish to always be the one stop solution to every family. From the moment a family's journey begins after connecting with us, we accompany them through the waters of life, be they rough or calm, to ensure they sail with KDSP always available to guide and support them. Through our 6 areas of service, KDSP serves as a KASHTI for its Family Network in this beautiful journey.



Khandani Sahara – Family Support: This year, our services further expanded in our Humrahi program. We got more mothers and caregivers to join hands in their journey together for emotional and informational support. This year also marked us achieving the milestone of conducting our 100th Family Support Group session.

Agaahi – Awareness: 1770+ individuals were engaged and sensitized about Down syndrome and thousands of hearts were touched through on-ground and digital means. The biggest event of the year – the KDSP Carnival 2022 – brought together over 5500 individuals to share our dream of creating an inclusive society for all individuals.

Sehat – Healthcare: 475+ consultations scheduled for individuals with Down syndrome through our Developmental Pediatric Clinics, partner hospitals and healthcare providers.

Healthcare camps on cardiac conditions and vision were also conducted to facilitate routine check-ups for individuals with Down syndrome.

Hunar – Skills Development: Our services grew to cater to the diverse needs of 140+ individuals with Down syndrome, with new programs introduced – Photography, Cooking and Baking and Pottery and Painting. Our Education for Life program was launched to help adults with Down syndrome inculcate activities of daily living to ultimately become self-sufficient in their lives.

Taleem – Education: 170+ children with Down syndrome and 30+ teachers and parents benefited from our inclusive education, preschool, after-school and home-based learning programs alongside teacher training workshops. This year we introduced a joint course with Aga Khan University Hospital- 'Inclusion Matters' which aims to empower parents, educationists and allied professionals on the best practices of inclusive education.

Ibtidayi Buniyaad – Early Childhood Intervention: Our services expanded to offer 400+ weekly sessions of physical, occupational and speech therapy. Furthermore, KDSP had the opportunity to build new collaborations with Dr. Essa Laboratory & Diagnostic Centre amongst other established health organizations.

This year also provided an opportunity for like-minded organizations serving the community to come together and create a larger impact, which is why KDSP officially collaborated with organizations such as the Orange Tree Foundation (OTF), Aga Khan University, Institute of Education Development (AKU-IED) to help raise awareness, provide access to medical consultations and support, advocate for inclusive education across the country and provide scholarships for individuals with Down syndrome to study in mainstream schools. Additionally, KDSP extended its international footprint by collaborating with the Deborah Foundation in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, to build the capacity of its professionals to serve the Down syndrome community in Ethiopia effectively.

As always, none of our milestones and successes would have been possible without the generous contribution of our friends, donors and supporters through which KDSP successfully raised PKR. 119,613,382 in donations and sponsorships this year. A donor's trust in the organization is reinforced through legally compliant, robust and transparent financial controls to ensure that all donations and sponsorships go towards improving the lives of individuals with Down syndrome and their families. Your support will help us go a long way in transforming the lives of individuals with Down syndrome and their families.

In the upcoming year KDSP is set to achieve greater milestones. I look forward to the support of our friends, families, well-wishers and partners in creating a more equitable and welcoming society for individuals with Down syndrome and their families.


Our Family Network








K-Electric Limited Awards 2022


Collaboration with Transcend Orthotics & Prosthetics


Joining Hands for Healthcare with Dr. Essa Lab



As they navigate the waters of life, KDSP serves as a KASHTI for its Family Network through its 6 areas of service:



K

Khandani Sahara - Family Support

Empowering parents and caregivers through informational, emotional and financial support to become the best advocates for their loved one with Down syndrome.



A

Agaahi - Awareness

Raising awareness about Down syndrome through digital media campaigns, distribution of awareness material in schools and hospitals, public events such as the all-inclusive annual carnival and partnering with relevant stakeholders in the community.



S

Sehat - Healthcare

Facilitating individuals with Down syndrome through access to affordable, high quality healthcare services by partnering with leading healthcare organizations.



H

Hunar - Skills Development

Organizing vocational skills training and social, physical and intellectual development programs to cater to children and adults with Down syndrome as well as their families.

Taleem - Education

Providing children with Down syndrome access to equal educational opportunities by inculcating school readiness skills in children with Down syndrome, offering afterschool academic support, developing sustainable partnerships with mainstream schools and building home-based learning capacities.

I struggled to accept my son's diagnosis for quite some time and the societal perceptions of the genetic condition made matters worse.

Ejaz's diagnosis of Down syndrome came as a shock to my husband and I, due to the way it was communicated with the sheer lack of empathy. I struggled to accept my son's diagnosis for quite some time and the societal perceptions of the genetic condition made matters worse. Eventually after 10 years of research to find the perfect school for Ejaz, I came across the Karachi Down Syndrome Program (KDSP).

Upon registering with KDSP we discovered Ejaz had passed the Early Childhood Intervention stage, hence he wasn't eligible for therapies, but that did not stop us from enrolling him in Music and Movement and Remote Education and Learning for Youth (RELY). Consistency is key and being persistent with these classes brought about discernable developmental and behavioral changes within Ejaz.

When trying to enroll Ejaz into the Tailored Assistance Program (TAP), the instructors expressed certain behavioral concerns within Ejaz. However, through Dr. Sidra's guidance and the discontinuation of incorrectly prescribed neurological medication by another doctor, Ejaz began to display fewer signs of agitation. He is now enrolled in TAP and attends their classes regularly amongst peers.

I am grateful for the support and guidance I have received from the KDSP Team, instructors and mothers of other children. I have always felt a sense of community here. My parting advice to other parents of children with Down syndrome is to not be uncertain and scared for your child's future. With the correct interventions and guidance our children are capable of achieving more than the society envisions.




Family Support Group



Humrahi was launched as a program to create a parent peer support group which aims to offer informational and emotional support to families within KDSP’s Network through trained parent mentors.


In October 2021, the program launched its second cohort with new parents completing the Humrahi training, hence broadening the circle of support for parents within KDSP.

Early Preschool Experience Program Support (EPEP)

An emotional processing support group led by an integrative psychotherapist and counsellor – Ms. Zahabia Anwar Ali was launched for parents and caregivers of children enrolled within EPEP in May 2022. The support group was aimed at providing parents with a safe and open space to share their challenges, emotions and feelings in order to find strength and support.

Behavior Management Workshop

In January 2022 a workshop was organized on **Behavior Management for Caregivers** of Individuals with Down syndrome. The workshop led by experts was divided into two sessions

- **Understanding Parent's Perspective - led by Ms. Zahabia Anwar**

Emotional support group for participants to share their challenges and openly express their emotions and feelings associated with the behavioral challenges exhibited by their children.

- **Understanding, Managing, and Teaching Behaviors - led by Ms. Isma Khan:**

An in-depth training to explore and discuss managing behaviors within individuals with Down syndrome.

When we compare the child who was in and out of hospital as a child and now look at all that he has gone on to achieve, we believe that KDSP breathed life back into my son.

Ali was quite unwell when he was born and frequent doctors visit seemed to have become the norm for us. During a visit to the doctor, a hospital staff member informed us of Ali's diagnosis, which brought with it a sense of ease and fear. Ease, because now we had a condition to attribute his poor health towards and fear because no one guided us on the way forward.

Later upon being admitted into a hospital after a bout of pneumonia, we were informed that Ali had a hole in his heart and was immuno-compromised. During this difficult time a doctor referred us to KDSP, where upon being registered, KDSP offered to pay for his IVIG treatment to sustain him. On his road to recovery, Ali was enrolled within all Early Childhood Intervention therapies at KDSP and we saw a tremendous change in him.

Not only did we see Ali gain energy and start to walk independently but he began to reach other developmental milestones in a timely manner as well. When we compare the child who was in and out of hospital and look at all that he has gone on to achieve, we believe that KDSP breathed life back into my son.

In the past I have guided more than 25 parents to come to visit KDSP and benefit from the services provided here that are tailor-made for individuals with Down syndrome. These services not just cater to the unique needs of individuals with Down syndrome but also aid in their journey of becoming independent members of society.



Aga Khan University Hospital - First Down Syndrome Clinic

KDSP's partnership with Aga Khan University Hospital (AKUH) continues to provide high quality and subsidized services to our individuals with Down syndrome, through the Down Syndrome Clinic established with the hospital in 2017.

At first parents would struggle to find trained specialists who were able to look after the health challenges faced by their children with Down syndrome. The clinic serves as a one-stop healthcare solution for individuals with Down syndrome, where they receive specialized care through doctors who are experts within their fields.



Behavior Therapy Launch

The program was launched in February 2022, under the guidance of BCBA certified - Ms. Faiza Bhamani. Ms. Faiza overlooks the Registered Behavior Technicians to assist them in independently conducting observations and assessments of individuals with Down syndrome requiring behavioral interventions.



Down Syndrome Training at The Indus Hospital


KDSP organized a one-day workshop at Indus Hospital in April 2022. The workshop invited physicians and residents of the hospital to attend a three part training covering the basics of care delivery for individuals with Down syndrome.

An Eye Testing Clinic was held in March to help screen for common ophthalmological concerns faced by individuals with Down syndrome. The clinic provided testing for refractive errors and the attendees were prescribed glasses accordingly.



Cardiology Clinic at KDSP

KDSP hosted a Pediatric Cardiology Clinic with Dr. Fatima Ali (Pediatric Cardiologist, Aga Khan University Hospital) in June 2022. Dr. Fatima Ali held a clinical screening and parents counseling clinic for simple congenital heart diseases at KDSP for which she was able to provide guidance on precautionary measures and future steps for individuals requiring treatment.

Developmental Pediatric Clinics

Developmental Pediatric Clinics were introduced at KDSP in 2018 with the aim to help parents identify the developmental trajectory of their children with Down syndrome.

The clinics are conducted by Dr. Sidra Kaleem Jafri, who is a Developmental Pediatrician and an Assistant Professor in the Department of Pediatrics and Child Health at Aga Khan University Hospital. Education for Life

This program was officially launched in May 2022. The program offers life skills classes, vocational training and physical activities for young adults with Down syndrome.

Photography

Ms. Ayesha Mir conducts the photography classes where she provides individuals with Down syndrome the opportunity to learn about camera angles, lighting and editing. The class incorporates field trips to allow students to photograph new spaces and landscapes.

Playhouse Club

The playhouse club was launched for children aged 4-12 to help them explore their creativity and learn to think outside the box. Activities ranged from augmented reality games to number sequence and spelling games.

Cooking and Baking

Within the culinary classes conducted by Ms. Zainab Durrani students learn a variety of different skills such as using kitchen equipment in a safe and independent manner, accurately measuring ingredients, and using their sense of taste, touch and smell to create their own food items.



Pottery & Painting

In classes conducted by Ms. Sadaf Zeeshan, students are provided with a creative outlet and the opportunity to use a range of painting mediums and clay art material.

Life Skills Certification

Students were provided certification for successful completion of the one year long module. In this program they were provided lessons on communication, identity, self-care, emotions, money, time management and digital awareness.

Since the very beginning; I have believed that having access to quality education is the best tool for living an independent life. However, I was not supported by our society to give that life to my child and on top of this, Umer was unable to go to school due to his health condition, which made it difficult for him to sit in one place for too long.

My husband came across KDSP through a Ramzan Transmission program and reached out right away and for the past 4 years, we have been connected with KDSP. Our first contact with KDSP was very welcoming and comforting. We were guided about how we can help Umer live a successful and good life. Gradually, Umer became part of RELY and we started his educational journey and now, both, he and I eagerly wait for new content to be shared with us to learn more, as I believe education is the key to success. Early Preschool Experience Program (EPEP)

EPEP at KDSP is a one year school readiness program for children between 1.5 to 3 years that aims to offer a smooth and successful transition in a mainstream school for children and parents. EPEP ensures this by helping children enhance their communication and language, fine motor, gross motor, cognition and play, social, emotional and self-help skills while involving parents as partners in their child's education.

Program for Inclusive Education (PIE)

PIE was set up to form partnerships with mainstream educational institutions to facilitate the admissions of children between ages 3 to 6 years. KDSP takes active measures to improve social, academic and cognitive conditions for children with Down syndrome within schools, by facilitating the end to end inclusion process. KDSP also trains parents and teachers of students enrolled in PIE to develop Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) in accordance with the child's developmental level.



Tailored Assistance Program (TAP)

TAP was launched in November 2019 to provide after school academic assistance to school-going children between ages 8-14 years to enhance their academic and social outcomes. The program aims to impart basic level numeracy, literacy, vocational, social and life skills for self-sufficiency.

Remote Education and Learning for Youth (RELY)

Launched during the pandemic in 2020, RELY is a meticulously engineered and structured curriculum which was introduced to the parents through several training sessions. Training topics included homeschooling methods and techniques, IEP development and SMART goals setting.






RELY and EPEP Parent Training Session

Sallah is currently benefiting from Occupational, Speech, and Physical therapies, and is also enrolled in EPEP classes at KDSP- along with evening remedial classes.

Muhammad Sallah was born pre-maturely in a hospital in Lahore, where we were settled at the time. He battled with several infections amidst a raging Covid-19 pandemic. Traveling back and forth hospitals became an everyday occurrence for us as Sallah had to get regular injections for his deteriorating health. This was the most distressing time for us.

Sallah was diagnosed with Down syndrome soon after his birth and right away he dealt with double pneumonia. Due to his compromised immune system that made his stay at Intensive Unit Care, which was also increasingly daunting for us especially his mother of course. When we received the news of Sallah's diagnosis we tried our best to keep an open mind, but it was a struggle to attend to "sympathetic calls" from many people. Regardless, both of us stayed strong and resilient in the face of unprecedented circumstances and challenges, we had to for our child! The support of close family and friends and belief in God's will aided us to seek the best help for our beloved son.

Sallah is aged four now, and we have observed a drastic improvement in his personality while tracking his progress after moving to Karachi in order to benefit from KDSP's services- on Dr. Kirmani's recommendation. Sallah is currently benefiting from Occupational, Speech, and Physical therapies, and is also enrolled in EPEP classes at KDSP- along with evening remedial classes. My son has now started independently walking and immensely enjoys spending time at KDSP with his peers and therapists.

We believe that children with Down syndrome have incredible potential and advise new parents to seek early intervention for their children and invest in them while paying no heed to what society dictates, so that these children can have a far better shot at life than what the society affords them currently.

The paper was also presented at the 2nd International Annual Conference at Centre for Business and Economic research (CBER), hosted by the Institutions of Business Administration (IBA). KDSP also proudly announces that the aforementioned paper has been published in Volume 17, Issue 3 of the Review of Disability Studies: An International Journal.

External Speaker Sessions

Dr. Nadia Ashiq, Head of Physical therapy at KDSP delivered a session at Indus Hospital on Child Growth & Development Patterns. Engaging the audience with the latest research in the field, Dr. Nadia guided attendees on principles of typical and neuro-divergent developmental trajectories.

Dr. Nadia Ashiq and Ms. Samar Naqvi, CEO at KDSP, were also invited by Iqra University for a seminar on World Down Syndrome Day, as more and more organizations are making a shift and adopting inclusive practices.



Re-opening in-person ECI and Healthcare services at 100%

After 18 months of conducting therapies virtually and via a hybrid set-up exploring the physical and virtual space, the ECI clinics finally resumed for on-site therapies fully- from October 2021. 260+ children with Down syndrome enrolled for therapy and their families were finally able to return comfortably and make use of the space, equipment and support available at KDSP. Therapy sessions continued with strict SOPs in place to ensure safety for everyone; all caregivers were required to submit proof of vaccinations before being granted into the office premises.

Occupational Therapy Training

In September 2021, Ms. Anjum Rahim provided insightful training on, "Supporting Functional Performance at Home and School for 3-7 year old children with Down syndrome". The training incorporated the use of different materials and techniques that are important for children with Down syndrome.




